In Search of Parker Johnson Kruse June 18, 1999 - July 3, 2021

Living near the Wisconsin River my entire life, my parents would tell us the dangers of the beautiful area natural resource. We in turn made sure our children had the same education and respect. Parker grew up fishing on the river with his friends. July 3rd, 2021 was a day no parent should have to go through. Parker and his friend saved a fellow fisherman that was drowning. Saving someone else cost him his life after he fell overboard from the other angler's boat spiraling out of control. With the river being so high, extremely swift currents swept Parker downstream. After the boating accident he remained missing for 356 days!

All of the fire and rescue departments that have the Wisconsin River go through them should have access to boats and trained river rescue/recovery personnel to help when an accident arises because we know there will be more. The extremely low river last year made it difficult at times to search for Parker as the river boats would often get stuck in the sand. The rescue boat that Muscoda Fire and Rescue are purchasing would be an absolutely perfect boat for this river. It would be able to go in extremely shallow areas of water and in many spots we couldn't get to. The surrounding communities would be blessed to have that type of boat as Parker went through every county downstream until he found his resting place in Grant County (which Muscoda is located in). My family and I are so thankful he was found before he made it to the Mississippi River. We have been blessed by so many communities even outside of our own that came to help us look for our son. We hope that Muscoda Fire and Rescue will be ready to help the next family

with a river emergency.

FLOW History and Purpose

During the 1980s, one of the groups instrumental in fighting to preserve this important slice of Wisconsin for all of us was called the Friends of the Lower Wisconsin River. The group went on a bit of a hiatus after winning the war, so-to-speak, in 1989 when the Lower Wisconsin State Riverway was established under Act 31. Later, the group came back to life when members realized that much more work was needed to protect the State Riverway. In 1998 FLOW kicked off once more under the guidance of Timm Zumm and former DNR State Riverway Coordinator, Dave Gjestson, with the goals of protecting the ecological integrity and public trust of the LWSR. By 2011, FLOW became organized as a 501c3 nonprofit conservation organization. Over the past decade FLOW has done so much to protect the Lower Wisconsin State Riverway, by partnering with the Lower Wisconsin State Riverway Board and DNR to sponsor activities ranging from river cleanup events to water pollution investigations to river safety.
